ALL SAINTS SUNDAY

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

Let us all rejoice in the Lord and keep a festival in honour of all the saints. Let us join with the angels in joyful praise of the Son of God.

OPENING PRAYER

Almighty God, you call your people to holiness. As we keep the festival of your saints, give us their meekness and poverty of spirit, a thirst for righteousness, and purity of heart. May we share with them the richness of your kingdom and be clothed in the glory you bestow. Grant this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever. **Amen**

FIRST READING (Revelation 7: 2-4; 9-14)

A reading from the Revelation of St John the Divine I, John, saw another angel rising where the sun rises, carrying the seal of the living God; he called in a powerful voice to the four angels whose duty it was to devastate land and sea, "Wait before you do any damage on land or at sea or to the trees, until we have put the seal on the foreheads of the servants of our God." Then I heard how many were sealed: a hundred and forty-four thousand, out of all the tribes of Israel.

After that I saw a huge number, impossible to count, of people from every nation, race, tribe and language; they were standing in front of the throne and in front of the Lamb, dressed in white robes and holding palms in their hands. They shouted aloud, "Victory to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!" And all the angels who were standing in a circle round the throne, surrounding the elders and the four animals, prostrated themselves before the throne, and touched the ground with their foreheads, worshipping God with these words: "Amen. Praise and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and strength to our God for ever and ever. Amen."

One of the elders then spoke, and asked me, "Do you know who these people are, dressed in white robes, and where they have come from?" I answered him, "You can tell me, my lord." Then he said, "These are the people who have been through the great persecution, and they have washed their robes white again in the blood of the Lamb."

This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

SECOND READING

(1 John 3:1-3)

A reading from the first letter of St John

See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God, and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is. And all who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure.

GOSPEL

(Matthew 5: 1-12)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew Glory to you, O Lord.

Seeing the crowds, Jesus went up the hill. There he sat down and was joined by his disciples. Then he began to speak. This is what he taught them:

"How blessed are the poor in spirit; theirs is the kingdom of heaven."

Blessed are the gentle:

they shall have the earth for their heritage.

Blessed are those who mourn:

they shall be comforted.

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for what is right: they shall be satisfied.

Blessed are the merciful:

they shall have mercy shown them.

Blessed are the pure in heart:

they shall see God.

Blessed are the peacemakers:

they shall be called sons of God.

Blessed are those who are persecuted in the cause of right: theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

"Blessed are you when people abuse you and persecute you and speak all kinds of calumny against you on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven."
